



Program and Education Outreach Intern – Plastic Pollution and Ocean Stewardship

The project will entail working closely with SOS Program staff to develop and lead educational activities on SOS topics such as ocean pollution. This intern will be called upon to lead and participate in public events such as beach cleanups and educational presentations. This position requires public speaking skills as well as office-work and organizational ability. Training is provided.

Schedule:

Dependent on hours needed and availability. 2-4 days per week (10-30 hours per week), including some weekend events. This is a one or two quarter internship.

Internships generally follow quarterly calendar: Winter, Spring, Summer, Fall.

Supervisors: Andrew Hoeksema, Coordinator of Volunteer Programs, and other program staff.

Work goals:

- Lead a minimum of 2 monthly events including beach clean-ups and festivals.
- Lead a minimum of 4 educational presentations.
- Assist with development and creation of public presentations and outreach events.
- Data entry and office support when needed.
- Support preparation for Save Our Shores' large annual events: Earth Day, July 4th/5th, Toast to the Coast, and Annual Coastal Cleanup.
- Independently work on new and existing projects, with staff support.
- Learn about the workings of a local environmental non-profit organization.

Requirements:

- Must be reliable and prompt.
- Must represent SOS in a professional manner including dress and attitude.
- Must respect and facilitate a quiet office work environment.
- Must have reliable transportation or familiarity with public transportation and willingness to transport program supplies to events.
- Must be honest about ability to complete projects before accepting them.
- Responsibility in completion of projects.
- Previous work experience strongly preferred.
